Victims

Ali Yehya Al-Kurdi — a Palestinian refugee- has been killed in Damascus due to the continuing conflict in Syria, the AGPS documentation team documented 3299 Palestinians have been killed due to the ongoing conflict in Syria.



Recent Updates

Palestinian Syrian refugees who were displaced to Egypt due to the ongoing conflict in Syria confirmed that the Egyptian authorities refused to give them the residency despite their existence in Egypt since many years and in spite of achieving all residency requirements in Egypt.



Under the economic difficulties that the Palestinian refugees are facing, 6000 Palestinian refugees moved to Egypt escaping the ongoing war in Syria, where many of them face difficulties to obtain a job due to the poor

economy in Egypt in one side, and refugees inability to work intensively because they do not have the residency in the other side.

The Palestinians of Syrian complain of the weakness of the formal representation of them in Egypt, where many of the refugees assure - to the AGPS documentation team - the Palestinian Embassy, PLO, and NGOs in Cairo are neglecting their legal aid and livelihood assistance.

In a different context, a German newspaper said that, Mahmod Deeb, from Khan Al-Sheih camp, with his friend saved an old German woman aged (79) as she fell on the train platform

(Banhof) in Iysn City in Germany According to the paper, 3 refugees hasten to rescue the old woman as the train was getting closer and closer to the station, whereas one of the refugees caught the old woman and lay under the train and then the three refugees got out with the old woman with some wounds. It is known that about 80 thousands of the Palestinian-Syrian refugees arrived to EU during the last 5 years.

In the southern of Damascus, a lot of middle and high school students left the besieged Yarmouk camp to complete the official supplementary exams for 2016, where UNRWA and the General Authority for Palestinian Arab Refugees assumed responsibility for the students take out and return them to the camp.

UNRWA announced on its website that many of the Palestinian students were forced to leave their schools because of the up-rising level of poverty, unemployment, and the difficulty in finding an alternative place to live.

It is noteworthy that the conflict in Syria still has a direct impact on the education of Palestinian refugees living in Syria as the Syrian conflict has dramatically reduced children and youth opportunities for education, where detention and killing are the main obstacles that a lot of high school students face while leaving the camp to deliver their exams (if they were allowed).

re-update their data. Also they called the UNRWA to disregard these conditions, and not to force the Palestinian refugee to go to the UNRWA offices because it adds extra charges that the refugee is unable to pay.

The number of Palestinian Syrian families who live in Bequa area has reached 950 families out of 12,000 Palestinian Syrian families who resorted to Lebanon escaping the ongoing war in Syria.

On the other side, Jordanian and Turkish authorities continue closing its borders in front of the Palestinian-Syrian refugees, in-spite of the international conventions that oblige all neighboring countries to receive refugees fleeing from wars, whereas the Turkish Embassies stopped giving permissions for the Palestinian-Syrian refugees since 3 years without giving any justifications as well as the Jordanian government issued a statement that prevent the Palestinian-Syrian refugees from entering Jordan without any justifications. Also the Lebanese authorities tighten procedures for the entry of Palestinian-Syrian refugees to their territory, so multiple sources of the working group for the Palestinians in Syria confirmed that the Palestinian refugees to enter Lebanon is extremely difficult and temperamental where they allow some and prevent the others for no reasons.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 27/07/2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015

- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1136 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1197 days, water was cut for 686 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 989 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1181 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 842 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
