Recent Updates

The Palestinian-Syrian student Majd Sindid, 11 years old, got the 13th rank in a Math competition that includes many participants from different German states, where Majd managed to join the competition in spite of the recent arrival to Germany.

Majd's brother Fares Sindid became a translator at the German school after learning German in less than a year. Where Fares helps the school administration and fresh students to communicate and keep in touch.



It is mentioned that, the brothers Fares and Majd Sindin did not delay their study after moving to Germany due to persistence to learn the German Language, and achieve all school enrollment admission requirements.

On the other hand, people of the Yarmouk camp suffer from a severe crisis in the water. People in the camp claim that the water is still cut off in all neighborhoods and the homes of the camp for 716 days respectively, due to the water shortage and power outage since more than three and a half years.

As an activist reported that, people mostly relied on artesian wells despite the fact that most of them are contaminated, which led to the spread of many diseases, including kidney diseases and public hygiene.

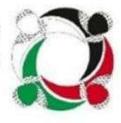
On a different topic, the Regular Army and some friendly Palestinian groups continue to prevent people of Al Sbeina camp to return to their homes for 1018 respectively, after being forced to leave due to the violent clashes between the Regular army and groups of armed Opposition, which ended with the complete dominant of the regular army on the camp.

According to witnesses, it is estimated that more than 80% of the camp is almost completely destroyed, specifically the area extended from the mosque Maaz bin Jabal until the camp's oven (Kurds Oven), which forms the western entrance of the camp. It is mentioned that, the residents have displaced to the neighboring towns and camps, which led them to a new suffering, not only leaving their houses, but also to include all of their lives, which turned into a tragedy because of the economic conditions, unemployment and the lack financial resources.

On the other hand, unofficial statistics of the AGPS indicate that more than 80% of the Palestinian refugees in Syria have lost their jobs and businesses due to the war in Syria, especially those associated with the besieged and destroyed Palestinian camps.

Unemployment was negatively reflected on the Palestinian families in Syria, many children had to leave school and find work that is not suitable to them, to help their parents to secure their daily food on one

hand and the reduction of the family expenses on the other hand, especially the displaced families that pay \$150 monthly.

In addition, the emergence of many problems associated with unemployment, including the exploitation of Palestinian youth by some Palestinian militant groups affiliated to the Syrian regime, where they recruited and forced them to fight the Syrian armed Opposition for \$75 per a month.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 27\08\2016

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till mid -2016
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1166 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1227 days, water was cut for 716 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 1019 days respectively.

- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1211 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 870 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
