



Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria



"Fighting renewed in South Damascus and the opposition stops an attack by ISIS on the outskirts of Yarmouk camp"

- Deraa camp bombarded with mortar shells
- Residents of Deraa camp call on UNRWA, PLO and the Palestinian factions to to perform their duties towards them
- A state of tension in Al-Muzayrib following the abduction of three young men from the town



Latest Developments:

Clashes were renewed in south Damascus between the armed Syrian opposition groups and ISIS, last night. Light and medium weapons were heard in the areas of fighting. ISIS was attempting to progress on the opposition's account, however AGPS confirmed its failure to do so.

In the meantime, the armed Syrian opposition groups stopped an attempted attack by ISIS targeting one of its locations close to the Japanese Hospital in Yarmouk camp.



According to our correspondent, ISIS attacked in the early hours of Wednesday, targeting the factions affiliated to the armed Syrian opposition groups, using RPJ mortars, as well as attempting to break into the hospital in an armored car, however the opposition groups managed to stop the attack.

In a similar context, the Syrian regime forces and its affiliated groups in Nisreen Road, targeted Al-Tadamon area, neighboring to Yarmouk camp. According to our reporter, they opened heavy fire using 14.5 caliber machine guns in Daaboul Road.



This came on the eleventh day of the closure of Yarmouk camp's only crossing, which supplies its residents with their necessary food supplies, by the Syrian opposition until it is neutralized and not attacked by ISIS. Despite the great danger to their lives, a number of civilians were still seen passing the crossing.

Yarmouk camp's residents continue to complain of the violations and repressive practices by ISIS against them. The residents are suffering from the siege imposed on the camp and the catastrophic humanitarian conditions that almost 3000 Palestinians are living.

In south Syria, AGPS's correspondent reported that the Syrian forces attacked areas of Deraa camp using three mortar shells, adding that the bombardment resulted in destructions to the residents' houses.

This comes amid the continued security tensions in the area controlled by the opposition, due to the assassinations, in addition to ISIS's attempt to come forward on the opposition's account.

In the same context, dozens of residents of Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees had a sit-in after Friday's prayers, to express their anger towards UNWRA, the Palestine Liberation Organization and the Palestinian factions, for their dereliction towards them, especially when it comes to the urgent relief aid.

The residents called on UNRWA to perform its duties towards the dozens of Palestinian families inside the camp and working on providing them with financial and relief aid, without taking the



area's security condition as an excuse as it will no longer be accepted.



The protesters also called on the Palestine Liberation Organization and the Palestinian factions to work on stopping the suffering of the people in the camp, who are suffering from water and power cuts, a lack of food supplies and the high prices of them, in addition to the extreme scarcity of medical services.

In another context, ISIS abducted three men from the town of Al-Muzayrib, south of Syria, causing a state of fear and worry among the residents.

There are continuous clashes between ISIS and the armed Syrian opposition groups in the town, amid fears of the residents from bombing attacks by ISIS targeting their town, similar to the attack which occurred a couple of days ago when ISIS targeted one the opposition's locations in the town, causing great destruction and the fall of a number of casualties and victims.

The remaining Palestinian refugees in the area are living in extremely harsh humanitarian conditions due to the continuous



fighting and clashes, the lack of financial resources, the widespread of unemployment, the cut of aids and the poor health conditions.



Palestinians of Syria: October 27, 2017 Statistics:

- The total number of victims documented by the Action Group is 3605, including 462 women
- 1640 Palestinians are locked up behind Syrian government's bars, 105 of which are women
- Yarmouk refugee camp is under the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine's siege for 1,563 days in a row
- 200 refugees, mainly in Yarmouk Camp, have died due to lack of medical care and malnutrition
- Water supplies have been cut off Deraa Camp for 1300 days, and 1140 days in Yarmouk Camp
- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo have been banned from their homes for 1,636 days. Government troops have taken over the camp for more than 387 days.
- Approximately 85 thousand Palestinian-Syrian refugees fled to Europe by the end of 2016



- 31 thousand refugees are located in Lebanon
- 17 thousand refugees are sheltered in Jordan
- 6 thousand refugees are in Egypt
- 8 thousand refugees are staying in Turkey
- One thousand refugees are present in Gaza
