Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria

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"The Palestinian Detained Women Toll Raise to 27 Detainees in the Syrian Regime Prisons after Arresting Three Women at Al Aedein Camp in Homs"



Sbeina camp

- The AGPS: 16 PLA Victims Die during February 2015
- The Displaced People of the Yarmouk Camp Sit-In at its Main Entrance to Demand their Return

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Detained Women

The toll of Palestinian detainees' women in the Syrian regime prisons has reached 27 women, after the Syrian security forces arrested three women from Al Aedein camp in Homs while trying to raid the house of Al Sayed family where an armed group was hiding. The forces arrested the three women in order to put pressure on the armed group and force them to surrender. Despite the group surrendered in condition of not harming their families and to release the detained women, the Syrian security forces did not release the women and executed the armed group; they are: Wisam Al Sayed, Rami Subheia, Ahmed Al Shaabi, and Abdul RaziqAmayri.

Meanwhile, the AGPS documented the names of 126 detainees at Al Aedein camp in Homs out of 765 Palestinian refugees are still in the Syrian prisons and their fate is unknown till this moment.

It is mentioned that the Palestinian woman in Syria has been arrested, kidnapped, killed, and handicapped due to the ongoing conflict in Syria since the beginning of the confrontations in March 2011 between the parties of the Syrian conflict.



The Palestinian Liberation Army

The AGPS documentation and monitoring team announced that the number of the PLA victims who died due to the ongoing conflict in Syria during February 2015 has reached 16 members most of them died due to military operations in Damascus suburb.



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In the same context, the AGPS revealed that it documented the names of 119 PLA victims who died since the beginning of the ongoing war in Syria, while the group received calls and appeals from a number of activists and families of the PLA victims who are obliged to perform the military service. The activists and the families demanded to directly call the PLA Chef of General Staff, the PLO, and the concerned parties to avoid their relative of being involved in the ongoing conflict in Syria and not to send their relatives to the tension areas, and to stop bloodshed of the Palestinian youth in a fight that not theirs.

It is noted that the Palestinian refugees in Syria are obliged to perform the PLA military service and everyone who refuses will be prosecuted and imprisoned, the thing that forced many youth who refuse to perform the military service during the ongoing war in Syria to leave and travel to the neighboring towns.

Recent Updates

Dozens of the Yarmouk displaced residents carried out a sit-in at the main entrance of the camp near Al Bateikha crossing to demand to return back to their houses, to end the siege imposed on thousands of its residents, and to neutralize it of the ongoing war in Syria.

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It is mentioned that the Syrian Regular Army and the groups of PFGC are imposing a strict siege on the Yarmouk camp for 601 days respectively, while power is cut for more than 681 days, the water cut for 171 days respectively, as the siege victims number raised to 169 victims, also they prevent the entry of food aid for more than 75 days.

Meanwhile, the residents of Jarmana camp, which is 8 km away from the Syrian capital of Damascus and located at the road leading to Damascus International Airport, are living in a state of fear and panic after they heard heavy explosion sounds which rocked the sides of the camp. The explosions turned out to be resulted of a bombing that targeted Al Raeis square in Jarmana area adjacent to the camp.

Furthermore, the residents of Jaramana camp are suffering of the water and the power cut for long periods, as the camp lives in a state of quietness in compare with other camps. The camp is suffering of difficult economic situation as the residents complain of the spread of unemployment, the high prices of food supplies, and the high cost of houses rent.

Meanwhile, the Syrian Regular Army and some affiliated Palestinian groups are still preventing the residents of Sbeina camp of returning to their homes for 471 days after they were forced to leave their houses following the violent clashes that broke out between the regular army and the opposition groups that ended with the Regular Army full control of the camp.

Eyewitnesses' estimation indicates that more than 80% of its buildings were completely demolished, particularly the area between Moath Ibn Jabal mosque and the bakery of the camp "Kurds bakery" which is considered the western entrance of the camp.

The residents were displaced to the neighboring towns and camps to be involve in a new suffering that exceeded leaving their homes but also included all their lives that turned out to a tragedy due to the economic conditions, the unemployment spread, and the lack of financial resources.

Many of the residents immigrated outside of Syria following the war and the difficult economic situation, as the UNRWA estimations indicate that the rate of the refugees of Sbeina camp, who were displaced to Lebanon,



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has reached 8.21% of the total refugees' number that is estimated with almost 50.000 refugees.

On the other hand, the adjacent areas of Al Ramdan camp, which is located almost 50 km east south of Damascus and 9 km away of Al Dameir city, are witnessing wide security tension that was negatively reflected on its residents who are complaining of instability and insecure due to the clashes and the shelling between the Regular Army and the opposition groups.

Moreover, the residents also suffer of stifling living crises; most important is the unemployment spread, the lack of food supplies, fuel, and medicine, in addition to the high cost of living.

Germany

The Palestinian League in Berlin called yesterday to participate in a solidarity evening entitled "Palestinians of Syria, New Nakba," on Saturday 28th of February in Dubai Dreams Hall in Berlin. It is mentioned that the Palestinian League and its institutions in Europe are having an active cultural mobility within some solidarity activities with the Palestinians of Syria in general and the Yarmouk camp in particular.





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Netherlands

The Palestinian League in Netherlands in cooperation with the Palestinian House called to participate in a solidarity sit-in in front of the Dutch Parliament, Den Haag, La Haye on next Tuesday 3rd of March to demand ending the suffering of the Palestinians of Syria and to end the Yarmouk siege in addition to neutralizing it and the return of its residents.

Numbers and Statistics till 27/2/2015

- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 601 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 681 days, water was cut for 171 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 169 victims.
- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 503 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 472 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 674 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 318 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
