#### Latest Developments

Sporadic clashes between ISIS and Fatah AlSham have been ongoing since predawn time on Friday in Yarmouk Camp. At the same time, ISIS released a video recording of the infiltrators who claimed responsibility for the latest blasts against Fatah AlSham.

Dozens were pronounced dead and others wounded, on both sides, in the simmering clashes. The health situation and living conditions have also sharply deteriorated in the besieged camp.

In the meantime, reports have emerged on the intent of the opposition battalions in Yalda to close off the main access road to the camp until the hostilities are over.



In another development, the Syrian government forces continue to drag Palestinian refugees to mandatory military conscription, forcing dozens to become internally displaced and dozens more to seek refuge in countries.

According to activists, the Palestinian refugees have been reluctant to join the pro-regime Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) after it turned out that the latter has been involved in war crimes against civilians all the way through the Syrian warfare.

Other refugees expressed their unyielding commitment to neutrality and disarmament in the raging conflict, believing that the Israeli occupation is their sole enemy.

According to field activists, several Palestinian conscripts were killed by the opposition outfits while fighting alongside the government troops.

Hundreds of refugees have been kidnapped at government-run checkpoints and forced to carry out mandatory conscription. Dozens more were kidnapped from their homes and shelters to that very end.

At least 203 PLA fighters were killed since the outburst of the Syrian conflict. Others who broke who away from the group and joined the opposition outfits were also killed as they fought against the government troops. Dozens have, meanwhile, died under torture in Syrian regime lock-ups and others, mostly dissidents, were killed by the government forces.

Meanwhile, the Palestinian refugee Omar Ibrahim Daraji, kidnapped from a government checkpoint in Qudsaya, in Rif Dimashq, has had a mysterious fate in Syrian government jails, where he has been held for the third consecutive year.

The missing refugee had been taking shelter in Yarmouk Camp. His family members and friends continue to appeal for information.

AGPS documented the internment of 1,187 Palestinians in Syrian regime prisons, among whom 87 female refugees.



#### Palestinians of Syria: April 28, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,483 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,188 Palestinian refugees, including 87 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,380 days in a row.
- 195 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,111 and 962 days.

- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,455 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 189 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
