"The Syrian Security Forces Release Two Palestinians After being Missed for Several Days"



- Two Palestinians Died in Syria, One of them Due to Torture in the Regime's Prisons
- Two Refugees Released from the Regime's Prisons after 3 and 4 Years of Detention
- The Islamic Relief Association Distributes Aids to a Number of Palestinian Families in Turkey

Victims

The Palestinian Young man, Ashraf Sayyah Al Dali, died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian Regime after being detained for a year. He is from Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb, a member of Al Mawasi trip. He was arrested while passing through Darousha checkpoint of the Syrian Regime near the camp on 16\5\2015.



Meanwhile, the refugee, Mohammed Hmeida, from Nairab camp in Aleppo city, died during clashes in the vicinity of Handarat camp between the Regular Army alongside Alquds brigade and the armed opposition groups. He was transferred to the Aljamaa hospital before he died there.

Recent Updates

The Syrian security released the Palestinian refugee, Mohammed Abed Abu Al Hasan, in the beginning of his forties, with his children who were arrested near Hama city on last Saturday. The released detainees were transferred to Bisan hospital at Al Aedein camp in Homs. The AGPS correspondent confirmed previously that a bus working from Homs and Hama passing through Al Salmeia was kidnapped and was carrying a number of Palestinian refugees.

The Palestinian refugee, Raed Al Shaabi, from Al Aedein camp in Homs, and a PLA officer, was released yesterday morning after being detained for 4 years at Sednaya prison of the Syrian Regime.

Syrian security forces also released the Palestinian youth "Obada Kanani" after being detained for more than three years in the prisons of the Syrian regime. He is from Deraa camp for Palestinian refugees south of Syria.



Meanwhile, the Islamic Society for the Relief of Orphans and the Needy Palestinian families displaced from Syria in the cities of Krkhan, Antioch, and Rihaniyya visited and offered urgent financial aid to about thirty families of the most needy in those cities. The Society also provided financial aid in the city of Iskenderun for about 25 Palestinian families.

The delegation then went to the city of Adana, where they met with 20 Palestinian families and provided them with financial aid before heading to the city of Mersin and meet with Palestinian families there. Financial sponsorships were distributed for 60 families, and then the delegation visited the central Turkey and met with Palestinian families in the city of Konya which resides about 25 Palestinian families.

Palestinians of Syria; Numbers and Statistics till 28\05\2016:

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Jordan
- 42.500 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Lebanon
- 6000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Egypt, according to the UNRWA statistics till July 2015
- 8000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Turkey
- 1000 Palestinian Syrian refugees are in Gaza
- More than 71.2 thousand Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe till the End of December 2015
- The Yarmouk Camp: siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC groups, continued for 1078 consecutive days. Power cut continued for more than 1139 days, water was cut for 628 days respectively. The number of siege victims is 187.
- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 932 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All Residents have left the camp for about 1 123 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 785 days without water and almost 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
