Victims

Palestinian refugee Layth Farid Ali, nicknamed Tago, died as took part in bloody battles in the Syrian territories. The victim was a resident of Jaramana Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq.

AGPS documented the death of 3,540 Palestinians since the outburst of the Syrian warfare.



Latest Developments

Sick civilians stranded in besieged Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Damascus, have been denied access out of the area to receive urgent treatment somewhere in the camp or in opposition-led zones.

A tough cordon has been enforced by the Syrian regime army and the Popular front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command on the camp for over 1,463.

According to AGPS data, at least 194 Palestinian refugees died as a result of undernourishment and medical neglect inflicted by the tough blockade on Yarmouk Camp.

Meanwhile, sounds of heavy blasts were spotted in Yarmouk at the crack of dawn. The source of the blast remains unknown.

ISIS has been holding sway over large parts of Yarmouk Camp since early April 2015.

In another development, AlMzeirib community, south of Syria, has been grappling with an acute dearth in drinking water after the local lake—the sole water supplier for hundreds of families in the area—has dried out as a result of the uncontrolled excavation of artesian water wells.

According to AGPS on-the-spot reporter, over 100 artesian water wells have been dug up in the area. The manipulation of water prices by the well owners has made the situation far worse for AlMzeirib community.

Residents of Daraa Camp have also been enduring a severe water crisis as the Syrian government continues to cut off water supplies to the area for 1,202 days in a row.

Those stranded in Daraa called on UNRWA, among other concerned parties and international institutions, to urgently step in so as to work out the crisis before it is too late.

Daraa residents further urged the International Red Cross Committee, which is responsible for securing clean water to war-affected zones, to assume its duty vis-à-vis the crisis.



Palestinians of Syria: July 28, 2017 Statistics:

- At least 3,542 Palestinians, including 463 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.
- 1,621 Palestinian refugees, including 102 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.
- Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,464 days in a row.
- 196 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,202 and 1,051 days.

- Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,545 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 298 days.
- Nearly 85,000 Palestinian refugees from Syria fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- 1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
