### **Recent Updates**

A number of activists and families of Palestinian detainees in the Syrian prisons accused the international and the Palestinian institutions and the PLO of neglecting and forgetting about their children's file and what they are exposed to in the Syrian regime's prisons.

They called, across messages received by the AGPS, the international and Palestinian organizations and the PLO to work for the release of their children and the disclosure of their fate and to intervene to stop the violations committed against them in the Syrian regime's prisons.

They also called to raise this issue at the highest possible levels and in international forums, especially in light of those released



certificates confirming Palestinian refugees subjected to various methods of torture, rape, and abuse of women.

The Syrian security services continue detaining more than 1,000 Palestinian refugees in its jails, including children, women, elderly, brothers, fathers, sons, entire families, and babies. The AGPS documented 1013 Palestinian refugees detained in Syrian prisons, including 73 Palestinian refugees who are still unaccounted for, confirming that the number of detainees is greater than the announced figure, as a result of the lack of official statistics, in addition to the fear of some detainees' families to disclose it.

The AGPS had previously demanded the release of Palestinian refugees in the regime's prisons and the disclosure of their fate, believing that what is happening in Syrian prisons is a crime by all standards, as well as to stop the systematic torture of detainees of Palestinian refugees, and to treat them according to international laws and regulations that prevent the torture of detainees basis of political opinion.

In the same context, the Syrian security forces released the Palestinian refugee, Helmey Halima, on 11.24.2015 after being detained for almost two years transferring between the investigation branches in Damascus.

Relatives of Halima confirmed that he was sick and paralyzed in his limbs as a result of torture and beatings on his head; he is from Al Aedein camp in Hama; originally from Tarshiha village in Palestine and he is at the end of thirties.



A number of released detainees have confirmed that part of the torture and beatings are implemented with green plastic rods used for health extensions in homes, known to Syrian security personnel as "Al Akhdar Al Ibrahimy."

52 Palestinian refugees from Al Aedein camp are still detaining in the regime's prisons, according to the AGPS statistics.

On the other hand, warplanes hovered in the sky of Khan Al Shieh camp Damascus suburb yesterday, coincided with sound of explosions after targeting neighboring areas.

Meanwhile, heavy machine guns targeted "Zakya - Khan Al Shieh" road which resulted in closing the road.

Zakia-Khan Al Shieh is the only remaining outlet for the people of the camp to reach the capital center, Damascus after the regular army checkpoints closed all roads linking the camp and Damascus.

In Sweden, dozens of people from the Yarmouk camp participated in a march in support of Al Aqsa mosque and the Palestinian people in occupied Palestine in the Swedish town of (gävle).

The march was attended by dozens of Swedish citizens from several Arab and foreign nationalities, during which shed cheers and words deplorable practices of Zionist enemy.

That city includes about 40 families from the Yarmouk camp who fled from the furnace of the Syrian war.



### **Civil Work Committees**

Jafr Foundation for Relief and Development announced, by its Facebook page, the intensity to distribute 1,000 food rations to displaced Palestinian families from the Yarmouk refugee camp at the neighboring towns of Yalda and Babbila.

It is worth mentioning that hundreds of families of the Yarmouk camp had been displaced from their homes following the storming of ISIS last April.

This comes under the tight siege imposed by the regular army and PFGC groups on the Yarmouk refugee camp about three years ago, which killed 184 refugees due to starvation and lack of medical care.



### **Numbers and Statistics till 28/11/2015:-**

- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 880 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 950 days, water was cut for 440 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 741 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 942 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 586 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.

- Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
