"Shelling Targets Khan Eshieh Camp and Violent Clashes in its Vicinities"

VICTIMS

The Palestinian-Syrian refugee "Nabila Khattab" from Al-Yarmouk Camp died yesterday in one of Damascus City's hospitals, knowing that she suffered from psychological disorder, and was transferred out of Al-Yarmouk camp two weeks ago after she got a serious heart attack.



RECENT UPDATES

Khan Eshieh camp was targeted by shelling and mortars according to the AGPS' correspondent, two shells fell on the eastern neighborhood with no injuries. This coincided with the explosion of the number of Shilka shots within the camp, in the meantime the artillery of the Syrian regime targeted Al-Qusour Street and Drousha Town and the surrounding areas of Khan Eshieh camp, which prompted the state of anxiety between civilians in the camp.

In a different context, the "Medical Rescue Center" in Al-Yarmouk camp called for all the medical bodies, institutions and associations to hold responsibility towards the besieged civilians inside the camp, and pointed out the need to secure fuel and medical supplies, explaining that many patients died in the Yarmouk camp due to lack of fuel and consumables Medical.

The center said that its medical cadres help people and civilians of the camp, conduct small surgeries under handy lights. Few days ago they had to operate an open-belly operation for an elderly under hard medical conditions. The situation is getting worse day after day for many of the elderly because of chronic diseases such as diabetes, blood pressure and the lack of medicine needed to provide treatment.



The siege imposed by the Regime's army and its militias considered to be the main cause of the stoppage of all hospitals and clinics inside the camp, due to prohibiting of medical supplies entry, in addition to forcing most of the relief agencies to stop working after ISIS dominated the camp since last April.

ARRESTEES

The Syrian regime continues arresting several Palestinian families under full secrecy about their fate, such as "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" family, which the Regime's security forces arrested all of its members in 27 July 2013 at Nasrin street checkpoint in the adjacent areas of Al-Yarmouk, they are: father "Mawloud Khaled Al-Abdullah" 73-year-old has heart sickness, mother "Debah Al-Ahmad" 65-years-old has diabetes sickness, daughter "Ilham Al-Abdullah" 48-years-old, daughter "Enam Al-Abdullah" 33-years-old, daughter "Yasmine Al-Abdullah" 39-years-old, and grandson "Obada Abdullah" 6-years-old who is Yasmine's son.

There were unconfirmed reports that the families that have been arrested in Al-Tadamun area were detained at one of the popular committees' members, while other news mentioned that they are in the Syrian Security branches in Damascus.

It is noteworthy that the AGPS documented 1025 Palestinian-Syrian prisoners in the prisons of the Syrian regime, including 75 women, while the total of torture victims in the prisons reached 426 refugees.

CIVIL SOCIETY WORKS

As part of its project "Winter Clothing Relief for Palestinian refugees in Syria" the "Palestine Charity Association" distributed firewood and winter clothing and financial assistance to families living in Khan Eshieh camp in Damascus Suburb, in order to ease the economic burden for them. According to organizers of the project; this comes at a time when most people in the camp are suffering from widespread unemployment especially after the closure of all roads between the camp and the center of the capital Damascus.



GAZA

Harsh living conditions are facing hundreds of Palestinian-Syrians who returned to the Gaza Strip escaping the war and arrests in Syria, added to difficult economic conditions in addition to the inability to secure housing and employment due to the catastrophic situation inside Gaza strip because of the wars and the ongoing blockade for several years.

In this regard, Al-Hayat newspaper, published in its yesterday's issue, a report talking about the hardships faced by the Palestinian-Syrian

refugee "Om Sawsan Al-Mubayyid" 65-years-old and her family who suffer from financial crises hinder their daily life After returning to Gaza, which made the option of returning back to Syria an obsession to the whole family,

In the same context; one of the Palestinian-Syrians has complained to the AGPS' correspondent in Gaza about the difficult living conditions which they suffer in Gaza, noting that they did not get so far any of the promises they had heard about.

The Palestinian-Syrian families in Gaza Strip had carried out a number of sit-ins in front of the Palestinian cabinet, protesting at what they described as neglect and procrastination policy practiced by the government of national reconciliation towards them, where they demanded the government and the PLO and the Palestinian factions and international institutions to do their role in protecting the refugees and giving sufficient support to meet the basic humanitarian needs and jobs.

It should be noted that the number of Palestinian-Syrian families in Gaza estimated at 240 families.

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 28 December 2015

- 15500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- More than 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe during the last 4 years.

- The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine General Command), continued for 909 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 979 days, water cut for 469 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 184 victims.
- Al Sheina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 770 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 971 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 614 days, and 70% of its buildings were distroyed.
- Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Homs and Aedein Hamma: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
