Latest Developments

AGPS documented the death of at least 3,415 Palestinian refugees in the raging Syrian warfare.

Shelling took away the lives of 1,129 Palestinians while 824 refugees were killed in clashes between the regime army and the opposition outfits.

457 Palestinians were, meanwhile, tortured to death in Syrian government lock-ups.

Meanwhile, Palestinian resident of Al-Sebina Camp Mahmoud Ahmad Haj Ahmad, from the pro-government Palestine Liberation Army (PLA), was kidnapped by the regime troops.

In another development, displaced Palestinian families seeking refuge in Deraa's northwestern town of Tseil, to the south of Syria, have sounded alarm bells over the abject living conditions they have been made to endure in the area.



The displaced civilians said they received no relief aids or foodstuff, except for a few food baskets and heating kit from the Palestine Charity Commission.

AGPS faced difficulties documenting the exact number of Palestinian families in Tseil town due to their unending dislodgement from and across the area. A number of displaced families moved to Jordan as they sought a provisional cover from deadly shelling.



Tseil town is located some 355 kilometers away from Deraa province. It is bordered by Sahem from the south and Wadi Al-Allan from the west.

At the same time, hundreds of displaced Palestinian families who fled to Al-Dukhaniya, Al-Kabas, and Dweil'a, in eastern Damascus, have been subjected to severe socio-economic crises due to unemployment and high rental fees.

The displaced families urged the UNRWA, the Palestine Liberation Organization (PLO), and the Palestinian factions to take up their duties vis-à-vis the crisis and take urgent action in order to secure civilians' safe access to their shelters in such refugee camps as Al-Sbeina and Yarmouk.



Palestinians of Syria: December 28, 2016 Statistics:

- *At least 3,415 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,137 Palestinian refugees, including 80 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,288 days in a row.*
- *192 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 992 and 807 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,334 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 70 days.*
- *Government troops ban residents of Al-Sbiena Camp from returning to their homes for 1,141 days running.*
- *Over 79,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until mid 2016.*
- *31,000 Palestinians are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17 Palestinians are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
