Latest Developments

Three Palestinian brothers—Khaled Mustafa Joudeh, born in 1982; Yehya Mustafa Joudeh, born in 1984; and Osama Mustafa Joudeh, born in 1990—were kidnapped by Syrian government forces from their shelter in Yalda town, south of Damascus.



The three brothers got their situation worked out with the Syrian authorities following the retreat of the opposition forces from the area.

Their two brothers Muhyi AlDeen and Marwan Mustafa Joudeh were tortured to death in Syrian state prisons.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,711 Palestinians in Syrian government dungeons.

Meanwhile, Palestinian refugees taking shelter in Daraa Camp appealed to the concerned authorities to repair power lines in the area.

The refugees said power lines were damaged as a result of the heavy shelling rocking the area.



Over recent months, the families have launched calls for removing trash and debris piled up in residential alleyways.

In another development, Palestinian refugee Osama Redwan AlKhatib, 21, called on the international human rights institutions and concerned authorities to help him garner data on his Egyptian mother Sabrine Ali Shehata, whom he has not seen for 20 years.



Osama had lived with his mother and father, Redwan, in Libya. He has lost contact with his mother since 1988.

In the meantime, the Turkish authorities released, on Thursday, December 27, the Palestinian refugee Mootaz Muhammad Fayad, formerly sheltered in Yarmouk Camp.

The Turkish police summoned Mootaz to questioning on October 17, 2018. He was arrested right as he turned himself in for interrogation.

His wife appealed to all concerned human rights institutions, political factions, and the Palestine Embassy to take urgent action



in order to pressurize the Turkish authorities to release her husband before it is too late.

Recently, a number of Palestinian refugees have been detained by the Turkish authorities over charges of illegal entry into the Turkish territories and for their failure to obtain the kimlik visa.
