"Water Crisis Exacerbates in Yarmouk after ISIS Seized Water Bumps Fuel"

Recent Updates

Residents of Yarmouk camp suffer of stifling water crisis that was exacerbated after ISIS completely seized the fuel needed for operating water bumps from wells, while people completely rely on those wells after the Syrian regime cut the water 260 days ago.

It was mentioned that ISIS seized about 3500 Liter of fuel that was preserved at Palestine Charity Committee headquarter near Abdulqader Al Husseni mosque at the beginning of this week, while the charity allocated this fuel for operating engines that extract water from wells.

Meanwhile, the regular army and the PFGC groups continue imposing strict siege on the Yarmouk refugee camp for 700 days which killed 176 refugees due to the lack of nutrition and medical care.

In Homs, on 20th of May, the Syrian security forces arrested the refugee "Ala Salaymeh," also known as Abu Ajaj from Al Aedein Camp; he is a member of a security committee affiliated to the Syrian regime. Meanwhile, the security forces released the refugee "Sulaiman Al Shabti" after being detained for Three days.



Turning to Lebanon, a group of Palestinian activists in Lebanon launched a campaign of "Together against UNRWA's Decision" in protest against the decision of UNRWA to stop shelter allowance for the Palestinian Syrian refugees who have been displaced to Lebanon.

In addition to a number of decisions and cuts that were highlighted by campaign the reduction of food allowance, the abolition of a number of schools, increase the number of students in the classroom, cancel appointments in education, health, relief and the rest of the schools, and the threat to expel 350 teachers in Lebanon schools.

Dozens of refugees closed an UNRWA office at Bidawi camp protesting the recent decision of stopping shelter allowance, which was provided by UNRWA to the Palestinian Syrian refugee in Lebanon.

It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon suffer from poor economic conditions because of the high cost of living and lack of job opportunities.

"Ahl Al Kheir" Convoy that was launched by the World Relief Organization in coordination with the Charity Commission for the Relief of the Palestinian people, arrived yesterday through the towns of Yalda and Babbila adjacent to Yarmouk camp in Damascus.

The convoy included about "1000" ration in addition to "2000" share of vegetables, where it was scheduled to be distributed to the people of Yarmouk who fled to the towns of Yalda and Biella following the storming of ISIS of the camp early April.

Meanwhile, the Charity Commission for Relief of Palestinian People distributed financial assistance to dozens of families with special needs of the displaced Palestinians of Syria at EinAl Hilwa refugee camp in Lebanon.



Distributing financial assistance in Lebanon

Numbers and Statistics till 28/5/2015

- *Thousands of Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.*
- *At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 869 detainees, and 391 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 700 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 770 days, water was cut for 260 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.*



- 80,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- *Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 581 days respectively.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 562 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 764 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 407 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.*
