Recent Updates

Heavy shelling targeted the adjacent farms of Khan Al Shieh camp- Damascus suburb with at least four explosive barrels that caused panic among residents for fear of shelling that would target their camp.

It is worth mentioning that hundreds of displaced families from neighboring areas fled to the camp, and suffer from difficult economic conditions.

Meanwhile, all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital Damascus re still closed except for "Zakya – Khan Al Shieh," which is exposed to frequent shelling.

In Damascus suburb, sporadic clashes broke out at Al Tiba town adjacent to Khan Dannon camp between the Syrian armed opposition groups and the Syrian regular army.

a state of careful calm prevailed the camp, while its residents are suffering from difficult living conditions, especially with the spread of unemployment and rising rents of houses.

In Damascus, dozens of Yarmouk students, who left the camp in order to perform their official exams, have returned





where a crowd of trapped residents who flocked to check on their children were waiting for the students who went through the middle of this month through the neighboring area of Beit Sahem in order to submit their final exams.

Turning to Lebanon, dozens of Palestinian refugee camps' residents, who are displaced in Tire area, carried out to a sit-in in front of UNRWA office denouncing the UNRWA's decisions to reduce financial aid and cut assistance.



The protesters also called on the Palestinian factions, the PLO, and the human rights organizations take immediate action to put pressure on the United Nations and UNRWA in order to stop these decisions and to treat them as refugees, according to regulations and legislation enacted by the international community.



Turkey

Unprecedented, the Turkish authorities deported number of refugees from Syria, including nine Palestinian Syrian refugees to the north of Syria, and that was after being arrested while trying to reach Greece.

According to one of the deportees, who asked not to be named, "that he had been arrested in the Turkish city of Izmir where they were harassed by the security men there before being deported by bus to a border camps as they were told, but at the border, the soldiers transferred them to the outside of the Turkish border and tell them they are forbidden from entering Turkish territory for a year.

The refugee stressed that the Turkish authorities did not give them any official document confirming the reason for deportation.

For their part, activists saw that this move constitutes a great threat to the lives of refugees owing to the acts of bombing and clashes at the Syrian north areas, as well as, the law and international norms prohibiting the return of refugees to areas of conflict where they fled.

Civil Work Committees

The Charity Commission for Relief of Palestinian People distributed "1000" bread packs for the displaced refugees from the Yarmouk camp in Yalda and Babbila areas.

It is worth mentioning that hundreds of Palestinian families from the Yarmouk camp had fled to the towns of Yalda and Babbila after ISIS storming of Yarmouk early April.



In a related context, Palestinians of Syria Committee in Lebanon in collaboration with the Humanitarian Relief Organization distributed clothing to a number of displaced Palestinian families in Beddawi camp in Tripoli, northern Lebanon.

Numbers and Statistics till 29/5/2015:-

- Thousands of Palestinian refugees escaped from Syria, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51300 refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till February 2015.
- At least 27933 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The number of Palestinian detainees who were documented by the AGPS has reached 869 detainees, and 391 victims were killed due to torture in the Syrian prisons.
- **The Yarmouk Camp:** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 701 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 771 days,



water was cut for 261 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.

- **80,000** Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from Syria to the neighboring towns, including 10,687 refugees in Jordan, 51,300 in Lebanon and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to UNRWA statistics till February 2015.
- **Al Husayneyya Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 582 days respectively.
- **Al Sbeina Camp:** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 563 days respectively.
- **Handarat Camp:** - Residents have left the camp for 765 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- **Dara'a Camp:** - It is now almost 408 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- **Jermana, AL Saieda ZAINAB, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:** - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- **Khan Al Sheih Camp:** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
