Victims

Palestinian young man Mohamed Ismail Abu Alila, called Abu Ammar, was killed as he fought alongside the pro-government Fatah AlIntifada battalion. The casualty was a resident of Khan Dannun Camp for Palestinian refugees, in Rif Dimashq.



At least 874 Palestinian refugees were fatally gunned down in war-torn Syria, according to AGPS statistics.

Recent Updates

An onslaught by the Syrian government army on AlSadd Road, housing Palestinian families in Daraa, claimed the life of the Palestinian young man Majdi Bassam AlSheini and resulted in heavy material damage.



Palestinians sheltered south of Syria have been enduring dire conditions due to the absence of relief assistance and health services in the area.

AlSadd Road is home to dozens of homeless Palestinian families, along with hundreds of families displaced from the beleaguered Daraa Camp.

Meanwhile, 1,604 Palestinians have been enduring mysterious fates in Syrian government lock-ups, among whom 99 female refugees. Reports have also emerged on dozens of



cases killed under torture in government penitentiaries.

The number is expected to be far higher due the government's reticence to disclose the fate of the detainees and the families' fears to report missing relatives for fear of retaliation.

Sworn affidavits by ex-prisoners provided evidence for harsh torture tactics and oppressive penal policies perpetrated against women, Palestinians in particular, in Syrian jails. Torture tactics included electric shocks, heavy beating using whips and iron sticks, and sexual abuse.

AGPS urges the Syrian government to disclose the fate of hundreds of Palestinian detainees. AGPS believes the torture tactics perpetrated in its lock-ups amount to "a barefaced war crime".

Civil Action Committees

Jafra Foundation for Relief and Youth Development in southern Damascus distributed food baskets to the residents of Yarmouk Camp.

According to Jafra staff members, the move aims to assuage the



abject situation endured by dozens of civilians who have been stranded in Yarmouk and several others who were forced out of the camp following ISIS take-over in early April 2015.

At the same time, the Palestine Charity Commission, in partnership with Khayra Ummah organization, distributed, on Sunday, allowances to 32 Palestinian orphans registered with the commission.

Palestinians of Syria: May 29, 2017 Statistics:

•At least 3,504 Palestinians, including 462 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.

1,603•Palestinian refugees, including 99 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.

•Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,410 days in a row.

- 196•Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.
- •Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,141 and 992 days.
- •Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,485 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 219 days.
- •Nearly 85,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees fled to Europe until the end of 2016.
- 31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.
- 17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.
- 6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.
- 8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.
- •1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.
