Victims

Al Mieary, a Palestinian Syrian Family at Neirab camp in Aleppo, confirmed that they identified three children within victims who drawn at the boat that capsized off the Libyan shores last Thursday; they are: Salam, Malak, and Bilal.



The three children are sons of the Palestinian refugee Ahmed Saleh Mieary, who survived with his wife and they are in a hospital under intensive care.

The Libyan Coast Guard in Tripoli had recovered dozens of immigrants' bodies who died on Thursday following the sinking of their boat, which was launched from the Libyan city of Zuwarah heading towards Italy.

The boat was carrying 400 people, and many people were probably trapped in the luggage store while capsized; more than 200 passengers were rescued; 147 of them were transferred to a detention facility for refugees in Sabratha west of Tripoli.

On the other hand, the PLA Lieutenant "Mohammad Niazi Eilouti" died during clashes in the town of Adra in Damascus suburb.

Sourced close to the Palestine Liberation Army reported that "Eilouti" died after an attack by an armed Syrian opposition group on a building in the town.

Recent Updates

Within the International Day for Enforced Disappearance Victims, the AGPS documented (961) Palestinian Syrian prisoners in the prisons of the Syrian regime, noting that the real number may exceed 1,500 detainees, because of the fear of many detainees' families to reveal the disappearance of their children in the regime prisons.

The AGPS renewed its call for the need to disclose the Places of missed refugees in branches of the Syrian security prisons, demanding the release of all refugees who have been forcibly disappeared. The AGPS also emphasizes the need to disclose the number, names, and places of burial of prisoners who died under torture.

For his part, the AGPS monitoring and documentation team confirms that the group has documented (414) Palestinian victims who died due to torture in the prisons of the Syrian regime.

On the other hand, Syrian warplanes targeted Muzeireeb town with two explosive devices, which resulted in the death of two unknown victims, while dozens were injured, and civilians' houses were damaged.

Meanwhile, missiles and explosive barrels target the southern region of Syria, including Daraa camp and Muzeireeb compound, which claimed the lives of many Palestinian refugees. The AGPS documented 325 victims were killed in Daraa province since the start of war events.



In the same context, two mortar shells targeted Alhara Alsharqia area at the sides of Khan Dannon camp in Damascus suburb, which resulted in two injuries among children, in addition to a number of mortar shells that targeted the adjacent farms.

This comes in light of the power cut for more than 24 hours, while the regular army still close all roads linking the camp with the center of the capital, Damascus, except Zakia-Khan Al Shieh road which forced people to go through it in spite of the risks they may face.

Turning to Greece, activists confirmed to the AGPS that dozens of Palestinian and Syrian refugees arrived this morning to one of the Greek military islands "Farmakonis."

The refugees are suffering from difficult situations, especially after running out of food and water, while they appealed the Red Cross, and the Greek Coast Guard to speed up access to them and provide them with assistance.



Numbers and Statistics till 29/8/2015

- 15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.
- At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.
- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 788 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 858 days, water was cut for 348 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 180 victims.

- Al Sbeina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 650 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 851 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 495 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.
- Jarmana, AL SaiedaZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.
