RECENT UPDATES

Al-Yarmouk camp has witnessed sporadic clashes over the last few hours. The tension came in the wake of an assassination attempt of Abu Salem Al-Iraqi, the deputy of ISIS head in the camp. Al-Iraqi was targeted by a road-side bomb in Al-Hajar Al-Aswad south Al-Yarmouk camp.

The two rivals, Al-Nusra Front and ISIS, exchanged fire for several hours over the narrow streets in the camp. AGPS' sources said that ISIS expelled Al-Nusar from one of its sites of Zaher Al-hannoun in the heart of the camp.



The sources added that Al-

Nusra fired shots at a motorcycle driver wearing military uniform, at Safad Street. These developments come under a widespread of fighters from the both parties over streets and the buildings in the camp.

On other hand, Syrian military helicopters dropped, at least, 4 explosive barrels on the outskirts of Khan Eshieh camp west Damascus. Only material damages reported. In the meanwhile, checkpoints are still block the last access from the camp to Damascus, which increased the plight of families regarding, particularly, the shortage of the basic needs.

In a different context, relatives of Palestinian female detainees in the Syrian prisons expressed their displeasure at the international and Palestinian institutions, particularly PLO, due to ignoring detainees' file.

The families demanded, through a letter received by AGPS, their daughters to be released, and to stop abusing Palestinian detainees inside prisons. The letter called for the organisations to raise the case at the international platforms, take actions to uncover their fate and get them released.

According to testimonies; female detainees were raped by Syrian officers and soldiers repetitively, tortured using a variety of methods such as electric shocks, and subjected to sexual abuse.

AGPS announced that it documented 75 Palestinian female arrestees out of 1043. All of them considered as enforced disappearance cases, with no information about their fate at all.

It is more likely that the real number of victims is more than the mentioned above, due to difficulties in the process of gathering the information, and the fears of punishments by Assad regime. It is noteworthy that the only statistics of Palestinian detainees is the AGPS one, while there is no official list by PLO.

NGOs

Al-Wafa campaign has distributed urgent aid to families of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Borj Al-Barajneh camp in the Lebanese capital of Beirut. The distribution included food packages and winter aid such as, blankets and mattresses, officials said. They continue that the assistance comes under project of "Together For A Warm Winter"

Palestinians of Syria in numbers and statistics Until 30 January 2016

15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 42,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.

More than 71,200 Palestinian Syrian refugees have arrived Europe until the end of December 2015.

The Yarmouk Camp: still under siege imposed by the Syrian Regime's Army and PFLP-GC (Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine – General Command), continued for 959 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 1021 days, water cut for 509 days. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 186 victims.

Al Sbeina Camp: Syrian Regime's Army still preventing the residents from returning back to their houses for 815 days respectively.

Handarat Camp: All of its residents have left the camp for 1008 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

Dara'a Camp: Running water cut continues for 669 days, and 70% of its buildings were destroyed.

Jarmana, AL-SaiedaZainab, Al-Raml, Al-Aedein Homs and AedeinHama: A relatively quiet situations in light of the economic crises.

Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia-Khan EShieh road.
