"More than 27,000 Inelegancy Notifications against Palestinians, Including 10,000 Arrest Notifications"

Recent Update

Zaman Al Wasl newspaper revealed through a report was issued a few days ago that the total notifications issued against the Palestinians is 27,628, including 9385 arrest notifications, what puts the Palestinians again among the top nationalities required for arrest by Syrian security forces, after Yemen, Tunisia, and Saudi Arabia nationalities.



The report, which based on private sources, noted that the Syrian intelligence divided Palestinians to 6 "categories," they are –as stated in the archive according to the newspaper -: Palestinians, Palestinians of Syria, Palestinians of Egypt, Palestinians of Iraq, Palestinians of Jordan, and Palestinians of Lebanon.

The category of "Palestinians" head the top with a total of 12,579 notifications, including 5241 arrest notifications, followed by "Palestinians of Syria" with a total of 4234 notifications, including 1680 arrest notifications, then "Palestinians of Jordan" with 3839 notifications, including 980 arrest notifications.

Shelling targeted Al Maghariba lane in the Yarmouk camp causing no casualties among civilians, as "ISIS" is still impose control over about 60% of neighborhoods and lanes of Yarmouk, while groups of the Syrian regular army and PFGC groups impose a tight siege on the Yarmouk refugee camp for 851 consecutive days.



In the same context, the Syrian regime forces located at Talet Al Kabuseia targeted Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb with artillery shells, where the AGPS correspondent in the camp reported that two shells hit a home of the Palestinian refugee "Abu Ali Hror" and a home of a displaced refugee, causing material damage in the place.

The checkpoints of the regular army are continuing to close all roads linking the camp and the center of the capital Damascus; forcing residents to take go through the dangerous sub road of (Khan Al Shieh - Zakya) to get to Damascus, where the road is frequently targeted way missiles and heavy machine guns.

The Palestinian refugee "Mahmoud Melhem" was injured by shell shrapnel that was fired at Al Maadameya district in the city of Aleppo, and then was taken to the hospital for treatment, note that Al Maadameya is permanently exposed to random shells for being located near a conflict zone between the regular army and opposition forces stationed in the vicinity of Salah al-Din and Saif Al Dawla area.





It is noteworthy that there are many Palestinian families live in the area suffer from dire humanitarian situation and economic crises due to the continuing conflict in Syria.

In Malaysia, the Malaysian authorities continue detaining the young man, "Ibrahim Abu Kharej" in Kuala Lumpur Airport for 52 consecutive days, where he appealed earlier the Palestinian Authority, the PLO, the Palestinian Embassy in Malaysia, the human rights organizations, and organizations of the United Nations for urgent action to release him, warning at the same time, the intention of the Malaysian authorities to deport him to Syria or Lebanon, which may pose a risk to his life.

It is noteworthy that he was arrested by the Cambodian authorities, who deported him to Malaysia, while trying to reach Europe.

Turning to Greece, where news agencies confirmed that 22 refugees were killed yesterday in two incidents of drowned while trying to reach Greek islands launching from the Turkish coast.

The Greek Coast Guards recovered the bodies of 19 migrants, including six women, eight children, and two babies on Friday morning off Kalymnos Island following the sinking of their boat. According to preliminary information, the boat was carrying about 150 people during the night and the Coast Guards rescued 138 migrants.

A woman and an infant sank in another boat, while six passengers were rescued while searching is still continues for another three refugees off the island of Rhodes.



In a speech to the parliament, the Greek Prime Minister, Alexis Tsipras, described this accident, as "a human tragedy," and said: "As a European administrator, I am ashamed of the inability of Europe to defend its values".

It is worth mentioning that international statistics indicate that 3000 immigrants drowned in the Mediterranean while trying to reach Europe.



Civil Work Committees

Al Marhama International Campaign distributed yesterday aid to the people of the Yarmouk refugee camp in the town of Yalda, which included aid rations and baby milk. According to those in charge of the campaign, the distribution began at 11:00 am, where food and baby milk were prepared in the warehouse and the lists were supplied by the specialized team. Meanwhile, hundreds of people arrived to the distribution points with the arrival of bread amounts allocated to them.





The distribution process was smooth, while the delegation listened to the needs of residents, and the convoy promised to make every effort and to identify their needs.

Numbers and Statistics till 30/10/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 851 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 921 days, water was cut for 411 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 182 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 712 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 913 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 557 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda Zainab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
