Statistics

The AGPS documentation team announced that the number of Palestinian female detainees in the Syrian regime's prisons, since the beginning of the ongoing war in Syria until the moment of preparing this report, has reached 50 Palestinian female Detainees.

15 female detainees are from Damascus suburb, 13 from Damascus, 4 from Homs, and 20 from different areas in Syria, while the AGPS revealed that it has documented the names of 37 Palestinian female refugees were lost in and outside Syrian territory.

The AGPS confirmed that there are Palestinian female detainees in each of the Palestinian camps; some of them were arrested at checkpoints in exits and entrances of the camps and towns.

The documentation team reported that: "Some of the detainees are university students or activists."

On January 6, 2013, the Architecture student (S - A) was arrested by members of the barrier located at the entrance Yarmouk camp, while on August 9, 2013, the student (S- E) was arrested from the campus in the city of Homs, where she was arrested for almost two weeks.

Syrian security services also arrested three female refugees from Al Aedein camp in Homs while trying to break into the house of Alsayed family where militants are hiding in order to put pressure on them to surrender, although the required people surrender in exchange for releasing the female detainees.



Evidences indicate that the number of arrested females who were arrested by the conflict parties is greater than this number, but it is secrecy for special reasons related to those cases.

The Palestinian women in Syria had been arrested, kidnapped, killed, and handicapped as a result of the ongoing conflict in Syria since the outbreak of fighting there in March 2011 between the parties of the Syrian crisis.

Recent Updates

A number of shells and bombing targeted Loubeia and Haifa Streets in Yarmouk south of the Syrian capital, which injured a woman with shrapnel in the head and was transferred to the hospital for treatment.

In terms of medical aspect, the PRCS in the camp renewed its call for UNRWA, International Red Cross, and medical and humanitarian organizations in the world to put pressure on the Syrian government in order to allow the entry of medicines and medical supplies to the



Yarmouk Palestinian refugee camp south of Damascus, due to the deteriorating health situation, the severe shortage of medicines, and the spread of many chronic diseases, typhoid, and jaundice among Yarmouk residents.

In Aleppo, Syrian security forces arrested Yasser Abd al-Rahim from Nairab camp; he is a member of the Palestinian pro-Regime Al-Quds Brigade.

It is worth mentioning that the Syrian security forces had previously arrested a number of Palestinian refugees from Alquds brigades in spite of their fighting alongside it, while activists indicates that these arrests come in the context of internal issues between groups and committees of the system.

In the same context, Syrian security forces released the two Palestinian refugees "Adham Dakour," and "Firas NAji" from Neirab camp in Aleppo after days of being arrested.

It was mentioned that Mr. Dakour was arrested on August 20, from his home in the camp, while Mr. Najiwas arrested a week ago as he was returning to the camp.



Libya

Libyan authorities announced on Saturday that they arrested three smugglers suspected of being involved in the sinking of a boat carrying migrants off the Libyan shores on Thursday night, which killed hundreds of Palestinian and Syrian refugees; three children of Amayri family from Neirab in Aleppo were identified, while dozens are still missing till the moment.

According to security sources, a number of suspects are still hiding. It is worth mentioning that Libya became a starting point for immigration trips toward Europe for those who fleeing from the ongoing war in Syria.



Greece

Hundreds of Palestinian and Syrian refugees stranded on "Farmakonis" Military Island in Greece renewed their appeal that they have made demanding and the international relief agencies to move quickly to help them.

Despite running out of food and water since yesterday, till the moment, they did not find any interaction by the Greek Authorities or humanitarian institutions existing on the Greek territory.



According to activists, the number of stranded on the island has reached about 500 immigrants, including dozens of women and children who had fled from the ravages of war in Syria.

Austria

On Saturday, The Austrian Police found 26 migrants including refugees from Syria in a dire humanitarian situation near the Austrian town of St.Peter Am Hart on the border with Germany with the possibility of suffocation without the reach of Police in the suitable time.

Two children were found in a dire state and they were carried to the hospital for treatment. It is mentioned that the incident follows the discovery of the corpses of 71 refugees in an abandoned lorry on an Austrian highway on Thursday, while the Austrian Authorities declared yesterday that they arrested four suspects.

Numbers and Statistics till 30/8/2015

- *15,500 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Jordan, 45,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees in Lebanon, and 6,000 refugees in Egypt, according to the UNRWA's statistics till July 2015.*
- *At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.*
- *The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 789 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 859 days, water was cut for 349 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 180 victims.*
- *Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 651 days respectively.*
- *Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 852 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.*
- *Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 496 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.*
- *Jarmana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.*
- *Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Shieh road.*
