“Two Palestinians were killed in Syria, One of them a PLA Officer”



- 950 Palestinian refugees were killed in the Yarmouk Camp till yesterday.
- A bus which was carrying civilians from Khan AL Sheih Camp through Zakia- Khan AL Sheih has been targeted.
- The Yarmouk Camp without water for 54 days respectively.
- The violent clashes in the vicinity of Handarat Camp in Aleppo were renewed.
- The Regular Army prevents the people of Al Sbeina Camp to return back to their houses for 357 days.

Victims

The old man” Jalal Dsuqi” died due to wound he attained as a result of being injured with shrapnel of a missile were dropped on 2-11-2014 near “Abdul Qader AL Hussein” Mosque at the Yarmouk Camp. The old man was severely injured which led to the amputation of his right hand, after that his health state was severely deteriorated and he was dead.

Mohammed Hayel Mohanna, a PLA sergeant, was killed due to the clashes that broke out in Damascus city, which raised the toll of the PLA victims, who were documented by the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, to 93 victims.

Statistics

The documentation and statistic steam of the Action Group for Palestinians of Syria, confirmed that they have documented 950 Palestinian Syrian refugees who were killed in the Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus. 155 of them were killed due to the strict siege imposed by the Syrian Army and groups of PFGC.



Recent Updates

A bus was carrying Palestinian refugees from Khan AL Sheih Camp in Damascus city was shot while passing through Zakia- Khan AL Sheih road, with no news about casualties. It is referred that the residents were forced to go through this road despite its risk, since the entire road that link the camp with the neighboring areas that were closed for several months due to clashes and bombardment.

In another context, heavy clashes renewed between the Regular Army and groups of the opposition in the vicinity of Handarat Camp, using all kinds of heavy and medium weapon. The regular Army seeks to control the areas that are controlled by the opposition, including the camp, while most of Handarat residents have been forced to leave their camp after the violent clashes that ended up with the control of the opposition, followed by heavy shelling with explosive barrels which targeted the camp and its vicinity.

The water cuts of the Yarmouk Camp in Damascus for 54 days respectively, where the residents are still suffering of securing drinking water and have to go to the adjacent areas to get water. Meanwhile, the members of the Regular Army and groups of PFGC still impose their strict siege, which led to the death of 155 refugees due to the lack of nutrition and medical care.



On the other hand, the Regular Army and some Palestinian Groups loyal to it are still preventing the residents of Al Husseneia Camp to return back to their homes, after being forced to leave their houses due to the violent clashes that broke out between the Regular Army and Groups of the opposition 357 days ago. The clashes ended up with full control of the Regular Army, while the residents fled to the adjacent cities and camps, which added new economic burdens, especially with the high cost of living and the high prices of renting houses.

The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics

- ***The Yarmouk Camp:*** - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for **486** days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than **569** days, water was cut for **56** days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached **155** victims.
- ***38*** Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria including **36** while trying to reach Europe.
- ***93*** PLO members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- ***Al Husayneyya Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **388** days respectively.
- ***Al Sbeina Camp:*** - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for **357** days respectively.
- ***Handarat Camp:*** - Residents have left the camp for **557** days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- ***Dara'a Camp:*** - It is now almost **203** days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- ***Khan Al Sheih Camp:*** - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- ***Khan Danoun Camp:*** - Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- ***Al Nairab Camp:*** - Power is still cut for more than a year.
- ***Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma:*** - A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
