Victims

Two Palestinians were killed in Syria, they are:

- *"Rami Mi'ari", 30 years, from AL NAirab camp in Aleppo, was killed after being missed several days ago.*

Recent Updates

People of Khan Dannon camp in Damascus city suffer of a complete cut of drinking water, the Group correspondent assured that dozens of people lining up since early morning to get a small quantity of drinking water. As he noted that power and telecommunication went off for several continues hours and that what increases the residents' suffering.

It is worth mentioning that the camp receives hundreds of Palestinian families who fled of their camps because of the siege and the bombardment.

On the other hand, Khan AL Sheih camp in Damascus city witnessed a warplanes hovering coincided with bombing targeted neighboring areas. Thus, internet and landlines still cut off on the camp since about three days. The camp and its vicinity witnessed notable tense in the past few days where it has been targeted with explosive barrels resulted in one victim and a number of injuries in addition to the massive destruction in civilian homes.

In a related context, sounds of exchanging fires were heard in Dara'a camp, coming out of Bina'a Al Waseim checkpoint at the sides of the camp. As for the living conditions, the remaining residence still suffer of



continuation of the absence of medical services due to the great destruction caused by repeated bombing.

The Siege imposed on Yarmouk camp by Regular Army and groups of Public front – General Command, still continuous since about a year, despite of the signing of the neutralization agreement two weeks ago. Yarmouk Refugee camp suffers of a severe shortage of food, basic supplies and medicines because of the siege.

On the other hand, Amnesty International Organization criticized the Lebanese Authority for prevention of Palestinian refugees, who escaped from the conflict in Syria, to enter Lebanon. Amnesty described that as a blatant discrimination action, in a report issued last Tuesday, confirming that the Lebanese Authorities imposed strict procedures on the Lebanese borders.

Amnesty also talked about evidences about the Lebanese Authorities who prevents the Palestinian Syrian refugees of entering Lebanon through Beirut International Airport. The organization considered, in its report, that the Lebanese Authorities procedures and policies towards Palestinian Syrian refugees caused a series of serious human rights violations.



Tunisia

Thirty Palestinian Syrian refugees escaped from a shelter of the Tunisian Ministry of Tourism, leaving their passports, that detained by Palestine embassy in Tunisia, in addition to their luggage.

In details, Quds Press agency said that resources in Tunisia confirmed that the detained Palestinian refugees in Tourism Ministry shelter at Al Hammamat area in Tunisia were escaped to unknown destination, leaving their passports and luggage, as their cell phones were turned off all the day.

According to the agency, sources in Tunisian Presidency confirmed that the interior Ministry has been searching for them since yesterday evening, as they thought that a group of them has managed to actually get out of Tunisia by smugglers. The rest of them could run out of the shelter in down and ride a train to Qabes city in the south of Tunisia despite the presence of guards on the shelter's gates and the Palestine embassy representative.

The Palestine embassy in Tunisia keeps their travel documents for more than a month. It is worth mentioning that the 30 Palestinian refugees were detained at the Carthage airport when their plane changed its destination form Libya to Tunisia because of the political problems in Libya.

The Tunisian authorities decided to enter them to Tunisian lands after the pressure that they faced from the national and international human rights and media organizations where the ministry of tourism received them for a month, note that the authorities didn't give them food and a local organization gave them food for the past few days.

The Palestine Charity organization introduced a library that contains 13000 various books to the administration of Abdel Qader Al Husini Mosque in the Yarmouk camp.
