Daily report on the situation of Palestinian refugees in Syria

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"Bombing on Al Wafedein Camp Resulted in Two Victims and a Number of Injuries, and Air Raids on the Vicinity of Khan Al Sheih Camp"



- Action Group: 1564 Palestinian victims were killed due to the ongoing conflict in Syria till 30-11-2014.
- Aids distribution resumption at the Yarmouk camp.
- Residents of the Yarmouk camp use manual pumps to extract water from the artesian wells.
- Water cut in Daraa camp for 234 days in light of complete absence of the basic services.
- Palestinians of Syria in Algeria suffer of hard living conditions.

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#### **Statistics**

The AGPS announced that the number of Palestinian refugee victims in Syria has reached 2564 victims, were killed during the ongoing events in Syria, according to its documented statistics till 30-11-2014.

According to the AGPS, 981 refugees were killed due to bombing, 522 were killed due to the armed clashes, 277 refugees were killed due to torture, 265 refugees were killed by sniper shot, 56 were killed due to unknown reasons, 93 were field executed, 68 were killed due to explosions, 33 were killed due to the chemical weapon, 27 were killed by Israeli shot, 29 were drawn, 35 were kidnapped and then killed, 14 were killed in a family massacre, 12 were killed by white weapon, 10 were assassinated, 15 were killed for other reasons "slaughter-health crises-lack of medical care- burn to death- building collapse- suffocating- or as a result of the crowd while receiving food aids "in the Yarmouk camp, while 157 were killed due to starvation because of the siege imposed on the Palestinian camps.

### Recent Updates

Bombing and several shells targeted different places of Al Wafedein camp and resulted in two victims and a number of wounded, while the camp, which includes a number of Palestinian refugees and displaced Syrians suffering from poverty case, unemployment and poor living conditions even before the outbreak of events in Syria.

In the meantime, warplanes launched raids on surrounding areas of Khan Al Sheih camp for Palestinian refugees in Damascus suburb, targeted the former headquarters of the Syrian news channel with several missiles causing the spread panic among the people due to the intensity of the explosions. It is mentioned that the surrounding areas of Khan Al Sheih camp are under almost daily bombardment, also referred that the camp has been subjected to repeated bombardment over the past months.

On the other hand, people in the camp is suffering of major crises in transportation because of the continuing closure of all roads linking between the camp and the center of the capital, due to clashes and frequent shelling taking place in those areas, but necessity has forced the

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residents to take "Zakia - Khan Al Shieh road" in spite of the risks, where many cars have been targeted during the past few months. In terms of living aspect, the markets of the camp are witness shortage of many basic items and rising prices of available items.

While the regular army and groups of PFGC checkpoints allowed to enter a limited amount of aid to the Yarmouk camp South of Damascus, which distributed to some residents who are besieged by those checkpoints for more than a year and a half, it comes in the light of the continued water cut for about three months ago respectively, forcing them to resort to the use of artesian wells in order to secure the needs of the water. The continued scarcity and uninterrupted of fuel forced them to return to primitive ways of extracting water from wells where they returned to use the old manual pumps to extract water, It is noteworthy that the regular army and the Popular Front groups impose a strict siege on the camp for more than a year and a half.

And, in turn, the residents of Daraa camp for Palestinian refugees southern Syria are complaining of continued water cuts from the camp for the fifth month respectively, which forced its residents to walk long distances to fetch drinking water, putting their lives at risk because of the spread of snipers on buildings overlooking the streets of the camp.

Daraa camp suffers from an acute shortage of medical and basic services after the destruction of large areas of it, in addition to the large mass of infrastructure due to heavy shelling which targeted the camp and the

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surrounding areas in recent months, while people complaining of the non-arrival of relief and private aid of UNRWA to their camp, in addition to the non-arrival of the ration and basic materials because of the permanently tense situation, prompting many families to flee to the regions and neighboring villages.

#### Algeria

Palestinian refugees in Algeria suffer from harsh living conditions, since they have not receive aid from any either local or international, as UNRWA does not provide anything on the pretext that they are outside the scope of their work, as well as the UN High Commissioner for Refugees refused registration of the Palestinian Embassy offered them help for once, while the Algerian refugee government considers Palestinians from Syria visitors as they entered through the call of someone close to not recognize any refugees and deal with them as a transaction Syrians who do not recognize them as refugees for political reasons related to the position of the Syrian crisis.

On the other hand, at the beginning of the crisis, the Algerian government, under public pressure, accepted to open a small camp for the Syrians and the Palestinians, which do not have room for more than 300 people in collaboration with the Algerian Red Crescent, and another camp for youth, also do not have room for more than 200 people in a remote area and surrounds them with complete confidential.

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It should be noted the Palestinian refugees began to arrive to Algeria since the beginning of June 2012, according to unofficial statistics, estimate the number of refugees around 4,000 refugees divided as follows: (900) refugees registered with consular embassy and about 1,000 refugees are not registered, about (2000) refugees are not registered because they hold the Algerian and Palestinian nationality (Moroccans).

#### The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 4/12/2014

- The Yarmouk Camp: Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 517 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 599 days, water was cut for 87 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.
- 41 Palestinian refugees were killed outside of Syria.
- 96 PLA members were killed due to Clashes in Syria.
- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 419days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 389 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 589 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 234 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
