# "Activists Share Leaked Video for the Destruction of Sbeina Camp"



#### The Leaked Video of Sbeina Camp

- Water cut in Daraa camp for 8 months and for 4 months in the Yarmouk camp.
- The continuation of reforming the transfer of power supply equipment operations in Neirab camp in Aleppo,
- Egyptian authorities continue to detain Palestinian Syrian refugees in its prisons.
- UNICEF offers a winter aid for the children of the Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon.
- General Manager of "UNRWA" opens an UNRWA school in Neirab camp.

Activists shared, on the Facebook, a leaked video for Sbeina Palestinian refugee camp in Damascus suburb, where the video shows the empty houses of the camp and the signs of uneven mass caused by bombings and clashes, as shown a number of shops and houses and signs of looting and destruction.

It is noteworthy that the regular army and some Palestinian groups loyal to it still preventing people of Sbeina camp to return to their homes, after being forced to leave the camp because of the violent clashes that broke out between the regular army and groups of armed opposition 393 days ago, which ended with the regular army full control on the camp. People of the camp have fled to neighboring towns and camps, which added a new economic burdens on them, especially with the high cost of living and rising rents houses.

On the other hand, water cuts for Daraa camp in southern Syria for eight months and four months in the Yarmouk refugee camp in a worsening humanitarian suffering, where the two camps are suffering from severe blackout and lack of medical services.

In Aleppo, the competent committees of maintaining electricity transmission equipments at Al Neirab camp in Aleppo continue its work,

where the camp witnessed, during the last days, the return of the power supply to several districts of it.

Our correspondent in the camp reported that work underway to restore power to most of the neighborhoods of the camp, while these procedures came after power cut for more than a year and a half.

In a related context, the Director General of UNRWA "Michael Kingsley" opened an UNRWA school during his inspection visit to the facilities of UNRWA in Neirab camp in Aleppo, as the visit included UNRWA schools, where he listened to the concerns and complaints of students and problems that reflect negatively on their education schools.

"Michael Kingsley" also visited the health center of UNRWA and briefed on the progress of work. In turn, doctors called to improve health services and the provision of some of the missing drugs.

Turning to Egypt, where the Egyptian authorities continue to detain a number of Palestinian Syrian refugees despite the conversion of the charge, leveled by the public prosecutor, from entering the country illegally to refugees of war, "56" Palestinian refugees still detained by the Egyptian authorities. The Egyptian authorities have detained the refugees while trying to reach Italy from Turkish beaches in 25 of the last month, where they were victim to a scam by smugglers who left them on one of the islands off the Egyptian shores, and that the Egyptian authorities arrested them.

It is noteworthy that Egyptian security released all Syrian detainees while it still detained "56" Palestinians, since all the surrounding countries in Syria refused to receive them, where the refugees' choice was between deported to Syria or stay in jail.


Meanwhile, "UNICEF" has announced that it will offer a winter aid to children of Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon on 9th of December 2014 through the use of ATM cards of UNRWA.

UNICEF mentioned that it will provide 45 thousand LP (30) dollars instead of winter clothing to every child refugee from Syria in Lebanon, at the age of 18 years and below, in condition that his information and data to be registered at UNRWA till 30th of October 2014, as UNICEF stressed that such assistance to the children of all the Palestinian refugee families from Syria in Lebanon is without exception.

#### The Palestinian Camps in Syria, Numbers and Statistics till 8/12/2014

• The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 521 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for more than 603 days, water was cut for 91 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached 157 victims.

- Al Husayneyya Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 423 days respectively.
- Al Sheina Camp: Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 393 days respectively.
- Handarat Camp: Residents have left the camp for 593 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.
- Dara'a Camp: It is now almost 238 days without water and a complete absence of basic services.
- Khan Al Sheih Camp: Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia road.
- Khan Danoun Camp: Economic crisis is still continuing, specially unemployment and high prices.
- Al Nairab Camp: Power is still cut for more than a year.
- Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Ca mps in Homs and Hamma: A relatively quite situation in light of the economic crises.
