"Palestinian Students Obtain First Ranks of High School at Syria"

Recent Updates

The Palestinian refugee female student, Nada Khalid Shwaheen, from the Yarmouk camp in Damascus won the first rank at Syria in high school exams, where she got (2754) marks in the arts branch.

Meanwhile, two Palestinian students from the Yarmouk refugee camp got the fourth rank at Syria in the scientific branch; they are: Yaman Mwafaq Atwa, while he got 2869 marks, and Mohammed Aladdin Jelbot, who got 2813 marks, as well as the Palestinian refugee "Mahmoud Yasser Shoaib" also got the first rank at Syria in the vocational high school exams.

This success comes despite the crisis faced by the Yarmouk refugee camp of bombing, destruction, arrest, continued siege imposed by the Syrian regime and its affiliated groups for (744) days respectively, power cut for more than (814) days, and water cut for 304 days respectively.

Activists and refugees said that this success reflects the distinctive character of the Palestinian and solid will displayed by the residents of the camp.

It is noteworthy that thousands of Palestinian students have lost their seats and schools by bombing, destruction, and continuing displacement from their camps.

On the other hand, repeated bombing which targeted the surrounding farms of Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb yesterday, have led to the outbreak of large fires which affected agricultural crops in Al Ouja area west of the camp.



It is worth mentioning that the Syrian warplanes dropped 4 explosive barrels on the sides of Khan Al Shieh camp yesterday, which targeted Al Saed and villas Streets in which its voices were heard strongly inside the camp, causing a state of extreme terror and fear among residents, especially women and children.

Moreover, Syrian army bombed (Regiment 137) military site at the vicinity of Al Salam highway and the adjacent farms with more than 40 artillery shells and RPGs.

The shelling coincided with violent clashes on the sides of the camp between the regular army and armed opposition groups, while some Shilka shots exploded on the rooftops of the camp.

However, all roads connecting between Khan Al Shieh camp and the surrounding areas are still closed except (Zakya – Khan Al Shieh,) which



is the only way that feeds the residents of the camp, knowing that many victims were killed by targeting this road.

The AGPS documented the names of 134 victims who died during war events in Syria.

On the other hand, the Palestinian Syrian regime forces arrested the Palestinian female refugee "Falasteen Fakhoury," (18 years) at Qatifa checkpoint; she is a resident of Zamalka City in Damascus suburb.

Al Qatifa checkpoint is considered one of the most prominent Syrian regime checkpoints on the road between Damascus and the Syrian provinces, and from which many Palestinian refugees were arrested on several charges, including failure to join the military service, or to prevent them from traveling under the pretext of heading to Turkey, or because he wanted by the Syrian security services.

In addition, the AGPS documented that the Syrian security arrested 49 Palestinian refugee does not know their fate and places of their detention, while the total toll of the AGPS statistics of Palestinian detainees in Syrian prisons has reached (921) detainees.

It is referred that families of male and female detainees are confidential of their relatives in detention for fear of their lives and hope for release them.

In Sbeineh camp, regular army and some Palestinian groups continue to prevent the people of Sbeineh camp to return to their homes for (606) days respectively, after being forced to leave because of violent clashes



that broke out between the regular army and groups of armed opposition, which ended with the regular army complete control over the camp.

According to eyewitness estimates, more than 80% of the camp is almost completely destructed and specifically area extended from Maaz bin Jabal mosque till the camp's bakery known as Kurds bakery, which forms the western entrance of the camp.



The residents have fled to neighboring towns and camps, the thing that bring them into a new nonstop suffering, but more than that to include all of their lives, which turned into a tragedy because of economic conditions, unemployment spread, and weak financial resources.



Civil Work Committees

Jafra Foundation for Relief and Development in Khan Al Shieh camp in Damascus suburb continues to provide services to the people of the camp, where the services team carried out a campaign to spray insecticides in the streets of the camp to combat insects that transmit diseases and are spread in the summer.



Numbers and Statistics till 11/7/2015:-

At least 36,000 Palestinian Syrian refugees have reached Europe during the last 4 years.

The Yarmouk Camp: - Siege, imposed by the Regular Army and PFGC, continued for 744 days respectively. In addition, power cuts continued for



more than 814 days, water was cut for 304 days respectively. The number of victims due to the siege has reached to 177 victims.

Al Husayneyya Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 625 days respectively.

Al Sbeina Camp: - Regular Army is still preventing the residents of the camp to return back to their houses for 606 days respectively.

Handarat Camp: - Residents have left the camp for 808 days after the Syrian Opposition Groups controlled it.

Dara'a Camp: - It is now almost 451 days without water and 70% of its buildings were demolished.

Jermana, AL Saieda ZAinab, Al Raml, Al Aedein Camps in Homs and Hamma: - A relatively quiet situation in light of the economic crises.

Khan Al Sheih Camp: - Roads linking the camp to the city center are still closed except for Zakia- Khan Al Sheih road.
