Latest Developments

Palestinian refugee Issam Mohamed Hajou succumbed to wounds he sustained in a bomb attack on the main court complex in the center of the Syrian capital, Damascus, on March 15, 2017. The attack took away the lives of 32 victims and left 100 others wounded.

Two Palestinian lawyers—Hayel Shaaban, a resident of Hittin in Damascus, and Shadi Am Ali, displaced from Yarmouk Camp—sustained injuries in the attack.

3,464 Palestinian refugees were killed in war-torn Syria, according to AGPS data.



Meanwhile, a couple of days earlier, Yarmouk Camp for Palestinian refugees, south of Damascus, was hit with a round of mortar shells targeting AlRija Square, led by Tahrir AlSham Commission.

At the same time, ISIS have tightened grip on the area and banned the entry of foodstuff to stranded civilians after declaring it a closed military zone.



In another development, Babila clinic, south of Damascus province, announced the launch of a campaign to vaccinate children against polio.

Families were called via the loudspeakers of local mosques in southern Damascus to accompany their children to the clinic.

The move comes a few days after three Palestinian newborns died in the area as their families failed to gain access to Damascus hospitals via government checkpoints.

Sometime earlier, the Palestine Charity Commission sounded the alarm over the acute dearth in children's medicine in southern Damascus.

Thousands of Palestinian refugees fled Yarmouk Camp to nearby towns after ISIS mobs grabbed hold of the shelter in April 2015, in cooperation with AlNusra Front. At the same time, the Syrian government forces and their war abettors have been denying civilians' access out of and into the shelter and cutting off power and water supplies to the camp.

In the meantime, Palestinian resident of Deraa's town of Jilin, Mohamed Ali Khalil, born in 1973, has been held in a Syrian government penitentiary for over four years.



Khalil was kidnapped on December 28, 2012 at the government-run AlDhahiya checkpoint pitched on Deraa-AlMuzeireeb Road.



At the same time, Palestinian refugee in Syria Abd al-Natour, a resident of AlNeirab Camp, in Aleppo, was released from a Syrian prison where had been incarcerated for over a couple of months.

At least 97 Palestinian residents of AlNeirab Camp are held in Syrian penitentiaries.

AGPS documented the incarceration of 1,175 Palestinian refugees in Syrian jails, among whom 83 women.

Palestinians of Syria: March 16, 2017 Statistics:

- *At least 3,464 Palestinians, including 455 women, were killed in war-torn Syria.*
- *1,176 Palestinian refugees, including 83 women, are incarcerated in Syrian government lock-ups.*
- *Yarmouk refugee camp has been blockaded by the Syrian regime army and Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine - General Command (PFLP-GC) for 1,363 days in a row.*
- *190 Palestinians died of undernourishment and medical neglect in the blockaded Yarmouk Camp.*
- *Water supplies cut off in Deraa and Yarmouk camps respectively for 1,069 and 877 days.*
- *Residents of Handarat Camp, in Aleppo, denied access to their homes for 1,413 days. Government battalions have been holding sway over the camp for more than 147 days.*

- *31,000 Palestinians from Syria are housed in Lebanon.*
- *17,000 Palestinians from Syria are taking refuge in Jordan.*
- *6,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in Egypt.*
- *8,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are taking shelter in Turkey.*
- *1,000 Palestinian-Syrian refugees are sheltered in the blockaded Gaza Strip.*
